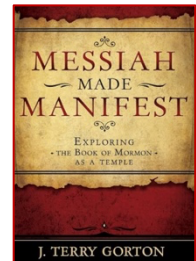


Brit. Lit. Tour “Meet Your Directors”

William Brugger



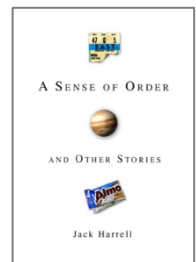
